LACROSSE LINGO

Before you head out to join the local team, be sure to read up on these common Lacrosse terms.

ATTACK The player position in the game that is stationed in the offensive end and is responsible for offense

CHECK An attempt to dislodge the ball from another player's stick by poking or slapping their stick or arms with either end of your stick, though most often the head

COOKIE Slang for the ball

CROSSE Proper name for a stick.

DEFENDER A player at the defense position

GUMBALL A shot that goes directly into the keeper's stick

ON THE HOP Common lacrosse term used to signify that players are to move into huddles and drills with at least a brisk jog; no walking!

PASS Throwing the ball with the stick to another player

RIP (Take a rip) Slang for a shot attempt on the goal

SQUIB To kick the ball or knock the ball away from a huge pile of people to one of your teammates

WALK THE DOG When a player runs down the field carrying the ball in their stick way out in front of them in one hand with their arm extended, and holding the bottom of the shaft.

A DEDICATED COACH

Coach Matt Spears is the volunteer coach for the Katy Lacrosse Club. He is a player of lacrosse himself and loves the game. He says, "The game is fast paced, aggressive, and is exciting to play and watch." His step-son, Keaton, was part of the original group of boys that wanted to form the Katy club. The players needed a coach, and they asked Matt to volunteer. He only committed for one year, but says, "Now both my step-sons are playing, and the first year was so rewarding, I have agreed to coach for this year and probably many more. The boys are very enthusiastic about the sport and are eager to learn and play. I have to end practice after three hours and they want to keep going. It is much more rewarding than I ever thought it would be, and the kids are great!"

FIND YOUR TEAM

Because the Katy Lacrosse Club is established through the Texas High School Lacrosse League, a player must play with the team that they are zoned to. Katy Lacrosse Club accepts players that are zoned to go to Katy High School and also accepts home school and private school students. Their practice season begins in August and runs through January. Game season starts in February and runs though mid-April. There are two other lacrosse clubs in the Katy Area - Taylor and Cinco Ranch. If you're not sure what club you're zoned to, then contact the THSLL at thsll.org to find your team.

Dowdell says of lacrosse, "It's not an easy sport. It is demanding, but it's also a lot of fun and boys just seem to love the heck out of it! I think it goes back to their younger years when they ran around with sticks, only now they are aluminum with nets and a very hard ball!" KM
