Last season, four teams had their eyes fixed on a playoff berth while the other two, already guaranteed a postseason trip, saw a district title on the line. In both contests with playoff implications, last minute touchdowns decided the outcomes. The district title game needed an overtime to crown a victor.

CINCO RANCH COUGARS

Cinco Ranch's district title was a long awaited step, but it does not satisfy a program pursuing the pinnacle of Texas high school football. "Losing our third round game by a field goal was disappointing," says head coach Don Clayton, "But [last season] certainly validates that we're on the right track. It's something to build on."

This year the Cougars need performance from quarterback Zach Myers, who has ten varsity starts at the position over the last two years. His downfield options include Carson Sublett and Joe Norrell, and junior K.C. Nlemchi receives the majority of the running responsibility. First team all district lineman Richard Glover leads the battle in the trenches. "Offensively, we're led by Glover. He's a very passionate and inspirational leader who's started 24 games for us," says Clayton. Defensively, linebackers Trevor Holt and James Radcliffe anchor the team. Radcliffe, a 2008 all district selection, is one of five returning players who received the

honor. Clayton believes the program can enjoy its second straight winning season, a feat unaccomplished by previous Cinco Ranch teams. "In the past, we've had good teams but slipped the year after. What distinguishes this group is the number of returning starters with leadership."

KATY TIGERS

After celebrating their second consecutive and fourth state championship of the decade, the Tigers go back to work just as hungry as ever. Even the excitement of a nationally televised game is not enough to distract head coach Gary Joseph and his team from their ultimate goal.

"It's no bigger than any other season opener," says Joseph about the ESPN matchup against North Shore, "You have to win some preseason games so the kids don't lose the taste of winning, but it's not nearly as important as our district games." Michael Stojkovic takes the snaps this season, and Will Jeffery and junior Vernon

Jefferies split time at running back. Junior Greg Morris, last year’s 100-meter dash district champion, adds speed to Katy’s receiving core. Offensive line experience comes from first team all district selection and team captain Shep Klinke, and Joseph expects tight end Zach Swanson to play a larger role with both passing and blocking assignments. Free safety and district defensive co-MVP Sam Holl leads a defense returning six starters. Linebacker Jonathan Fisher, another of four players elected team captain, also oversees the team on the field with his senior leadership.

MAYDE CREEK RAMS

A touchdown against Morton Ranch with two minutes on the clock punched Mayde Creek’s playoff ticket. Head coach Lance Carter takes five offensive and five defensive starters from last season’s team into 2009. Quarterback Lucas Leonard only played two regular season games last year, the first and last, with injury sidelining him for the others. His duel threat capabilities fuel the Ram offense, one that looks for more run production this year.

“One of our goals coming out of spring football was to solidify the run game,” says Carter, “We have more depth in the running back position than we’ve had in the past, and Leonard is just as fast as them as well.” Running backs Devonte Babin and junior Graylyn Vital provide speedy rushing ability. When Mayde Creek does choose to throw, Brady Atkinson leads the receiving core and is often the intended target. The Rams’ defensive strategy matches the quick pace of the team’s no huddle offense. “Our philosophy is putting speed on the field. We want kids to be able to get off blocks and get to the football. We’re not big, but we’re quite fast this year,”

Carter says. Production also hinges on the linemen core, which he says still needs work and depth but has the capability to step up.

MORTON RANCH MAVERICKS

Morton Ranch’s football program presses on despite the loss of head coach Scott Svendsen , defensive coordinator Cody Haug, and offensive coordinator Jeremy Orsagh. The Katy ISD school board voted to terminate the three coaches’ contracts for policy violations pertaining to improper use of funds, athletic eligibility, and student records. As of the time of print, the coaches have not appealed the decision. Dave Meadows has been named head football coach and is working to get the Mavs back on track. “Our kids are resilient,” says assistant head coach Jeffrey Seeton. “They have bounced back well and are focused on the things they can control today.”

According to Seeton, the Mavs learned how to win last season. The three-year-old varsity team went from winning only one out of 20 games to a 6-4 record last year. Seeton says the focus right now is finishing the season. “We have matured enough to have an underlying caution that if we don’t finish, how we start is of no consequence.”

Most of the team’s experience lies in the defensive unit, which returns eight players including defensive lineman Kennedy Jones and defensive back Floyd Mattison. Other players to watch this year at Morton Ranch are Wesley Hudson-RB, Andre Rhodes – RB, Ahmed Barrie-Corner, Jordan Washington-Rec, Stuart Mouchantaf-DL, Mike Mustafa-DL, and Matt Leonard-LB.

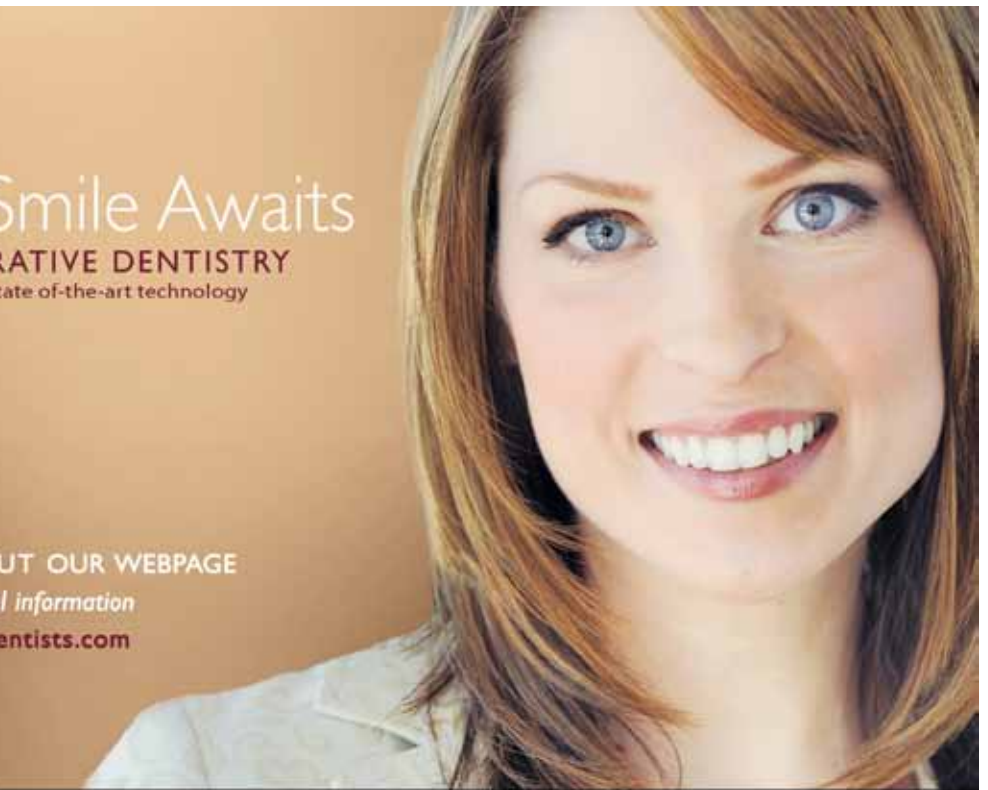

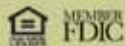

SEVEN LAKES SPARTANS

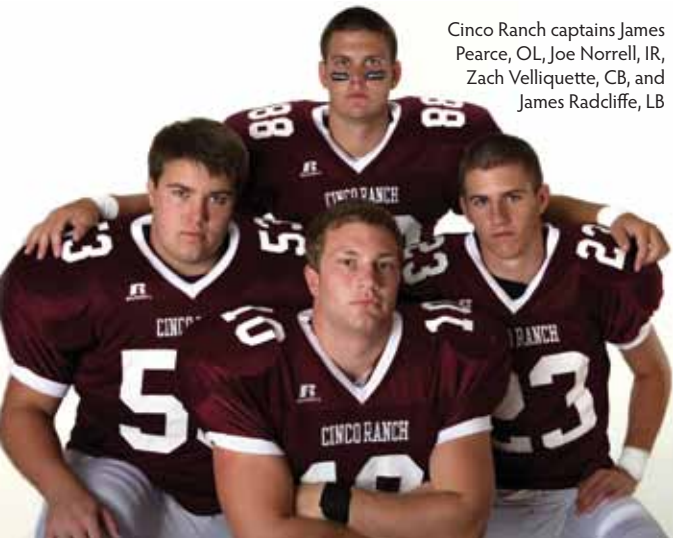
Head coach Kevin O'Keefe appreciates the progress his team made last season by being competitive in several games but sees loftier aspirations for 2009. "Where playoffs may not have been a realistic goal before, [this year] it's attainable and the minimum goal of this team," says O'Keefe. Christian Duda moves from the receiving position to make his first start at quarterback since freshman year.

Duda's receivers include Taylor Morris and junior Kendall Stacks. Two-year starting center Collin Fissell leads an improved offensive line, a unit on which the team relies. "The big goal of spring football was to develop the offensive line," says O'Keefe, "The other thing offensively was improvement in the running game." Senior running backs Elix Rome, Leekus Green, and Dominic Rose share the backfield along with senior Michael Stubbs, the best fullback Coach O'Keefe says he has ever coached. Defensively, "We'll have multiple packages," says O'Keefe, "we'll try to be very aggressive and attacking." Junior safety Blake Poncio, a 2008 first team all district selection, and defensive lineman EK Yancy lead a young defensive unit capable of punishing opponents.

TAYLOR MUSTANGS

In their last game of district play, Taylor pulled ahead of Seven Lakes with eight seconds left and earned a playoff berth that lasted three rounds. It is up to second year head coach Flint Risien and his staff to combine experience and new talent for additional success this season.

The new talent includes a new offensive coordinator, Doug Stephens. Risien says the play calling will still maintain a style and balance similar to that of last year's offense, which generated nearly equal amounts of rushing and passing yardage. Lee Rodgers starts at quarterback for the second straight year. Since the beginning of last year, Rodgers has seen improvement in the team's mentality. "We don't have to coach work ethic anymore," says Rodgers, "Everyone's giving that effort and matured that way. Now we can focus more on executing plays."

Tight end Trent Guiberteau also enters 2009 with a year of varsity experience, while Harry Hughes and junior Bright Ashaka both debut as varsity running backs. A young secondary that graduated all of last year's starters must also step up to match last season's success. "Our biggest question mark is in the defensive backs and safeties," says Risien, "They'll have a baptism by fire." KM

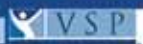
