


10 Fun Things To Do This Summer

Family Fun Activities Just Outside of Katy




Rock the Dock at Kemah Boardwalk





5 Noah's Ark Pool

Moody Gardens Theme Park

Located on Galveston Island about an hour and a half from Katy, Moody Gardens is a theme park and resort hotel that has something for everyone. Start at stepping into Dinosaurs Alive! Kids and parents will enjoy walking around the Jurassic Jungle amid 20 enormous dinosaurs with lifelike movements and sounds. Next, see sharks, sea turtles, eels, and thousands of tropical fish in at their Aguarium Pyramid. Moody Gardens also has a lush Rainforest with 2,000 species of exotic plants, tropical trees, and macaws galore. Guests will also enjoy a 45-minute paddle boat cruise around Offats Bayou. The Great Texas Mosquito **Festival**

About 55 miles southeast of Houston, the Great Texas Mosquito Festival is scheduled to take place in Clute from July 23 through 25. This three-day event is filled with fun for the whole family and includes outrageous events such as doubles horseshoe pitching, doubles washer pitching, a mosquito calling contest, a haystack dive, and a dodge ball sting tournament, just to name a few. Houston Shakespeare **Festival**
