So get your kids involved in the planning, round up your friends and neighbors, and follow these tips for a summer celebration that people will be talking about for the rest of the season.

Pre-Party Preparations

Plan the party a few weeks in advance, allowing yourself time to maintain the cleanliness of your pool. Since the pool is going to be the focal point of the party, you want it to be a dazzling shade of blue under the summer sun. If you don't have your own pool, this advanced planning allows for time to book the event at your neighborhood pool.

Send the Invites

The invitation sets the tone for the party, so you want it to be creative and eye-catching. If you choose to follow a theme throughout the party, this is the first opportunity to show what that theme will be. You can do the standard luau theme or opt for something more unusual, like a Mexican fiesta, sea creatures, pirate theme, or a Survivor party with relays and games. As you consider the number of people you want to invite, you must first determine the number of people who will fit comfortably and safely into your backyard and pool.

Setting the Scene

If you chose the luau theme, set up tiki torches around the perimeter of the yard. As guests arrive, hand out leis and grass skirts. If you have the capability at home or at the community pool, set up a stereo and speakers and play Hawaiian music in the background. If you don't have a theme for the party, just make sure the music is appropriate for kids of all ages. Other fun summer decorations include beach balls, sunglasses, bright beach towels, and flip flop sandals. You can find plates, napkins, and cups to match most beach, summer, and luau themes at party stores.

Safety First

Although the pool provides the setting for the perfect summer party, it's also the biggest hazard of the event. When children are in or near the water, make sure there are always several adults monitoring the situation. If you don't have them already, purchase life vests and other flotation devices for kids, and encourage parents of little ones to bring their own. If you think the party is going to be too large to keep watch over the pool at all times, hire a lifeguard to help out. You should also have sunscreen on hand, and remind everyone to apply it throughout the day.



Party Provisions

The food options are limitless for a pool party. You can opt for a light buffet of fruit and veggie trays and some chips and dip, or you can pull out the grill for hamburgers and hotdogs. Potluck meals are also a great route, as they take the burden of food off of just the host. The easiest option by far though is to order a variety of pizzas and have


Let the Games Begin
