Carol Eckels Adams

City Council Member and Executive Director of the Katy Heritage Society

Carol Adams has always been passionate about giving back to the Katy community and currently serves as executive director of the Katy Heritage Society. As part of her service to the organization, she was instrumental in moving historic homes to create Katy Heritage Park. The project was not without controversy, but Adams stuck to what she believed to be best for Katy, and now the park is a wonderful and popular Katy destination.

Adams also suggested the ongoing All Aboard Katy project, which is sure to become a popular city attraction. The concept was developed as a way to unite Katy through public art placed around town and is similar to the Chicago Cows community art project which quickly attracted national attention. "I think that this will be a powerful association with Katy," Adams says.

She is a firm believer that anyone can make time in their schedule to contribute to their community. "We all have time," says Adams. She continues to see Katy as a community rich in history, promise, and hope for the future. As such, Adams strives to make a difference in Katy every day and encourages others to do the same on whatever level they can make time for. "Human energy and creativity are limitless," she shares. "My family might tell you that there have been sacrifices related to my passion to serve Katy, but we make those sacrifices as a family and they, too take pride in what I have done for our home, Katy."

Rebecca Blackmon

First Female in the Katy Rotary and Long-Time Banker

Rebecca Blackmon gets to help the people of Katy in both her professional career and her volunteer endeavors. In 1983, Blackmon began working in Katy as a lender and branch manager for a community bank, and has been serving as a local professional ever since. In her career, Blackmon is motivated to help and serve others. "I truly get satisfaction from being able to help someone out," she says. "Especially if that someone might otherwise fall between the cracks."

Perhaps the accomplishment Blackmon is most proud of is her volunteer work with the Katy Rotary Club. In 1989, the Supreme Court ruled that Rotary International must allow women to join, having previously excluded them from its membership. As a true trailblazer, Blackmon was one of the local chapter's first female members and has continued to serve with enthusiasm throughout the years. "I was truly honored and later was asked to serve as president," she says.

In both her professional and personal endeavors, Blackmon takes great pride in serving the people of Katy, helping to pave the way for the community's future leaders. "If I've helped one business start or expand in Katy, if I've helped one person buy, build, or improve their home here, or if I've helped one person send their child to college, then maybe I've made a difference," says Blackmon. <complex-block>

Lynn Cardiff

Founder of the Katy Heritage Society, Volunteer, and Local Personality

From hosting a televised cooking show to making the Katy Rice Harvest Festival a local tradition, Lynn Cardiff has made her mark in Katy. When she first moved to the area in 1955, she quickly fell in love with the town. "It was a wonderful place to rear children and feel the sun on your face," she says. She became concerned for her community during the Katy Depot debate and one passionate project led to another, making Cardiff a lifetime supporter and volunteer for multiple local causes.

It was her passion to save the Katy Depot that led her to participate in helping create the Katy Heritage Society. Cardiff is the reason the caboose still sits on display at the Katy Depot today. As a proud Katyite and former executive director of the Katy Chamber of Commerce she also proved instrumental in planning the first Katy Rice Harvest Festival. Even though the festival has changed and grown throughout the years, she is happy to see the people have the same spirit of goodwill. "The community spirit of reaching out to the whole Katy community has not changed," says Cardiff.

Perhaps one of her most acclaimed accomplishments was hosting Katy's Kitchen, a televised cooking show where she brought in fellow Katyites to share their recipes for all to enjoy. While popular, the show went off the air when its young director followed another path based on the show's great success. Katy has been part of Cardiff's family for over 100 years, and she is quick to praise the town she so loves. "Of course I've seen changes, but Katy still has the same hometown feel," she says.



Ann Hodge


President of the Katy Area Chamber of Commerce and Community Leader


