

With no hotel needed, families can enjoy day trips to many popular Houston hotspots – a trend that is growing by leaps and bounds. "We can attribute our increased attendance last year at least in part to the staycation phenom," says Brian Hill, director of public relations for the Houston Zoo. "In 2009, in fact, we set a record for August attendance."

Sunshine and Simple Pleasures

Many families look for ways to have fun during a staycation, while introducing their children to a unique, educational experience. Forbidden Gardens does just that as is takes you back in time to ancient China. The museum is outdoors, so it can be a lovely spot to enjoy on a beautiful summer day.

"Sometimes, just going to the parks can be the best thing," explains Katy mom of three, Stephanie Kennedy. "We are lucky to be in Katy where there are many pocket parks that can sometimes be the best kept secret for an afternoon family outing." Last summer, the Kennedy family got creative and found fun, exciting activities to enjoy around their Katy home. "We wanted to teach our children the importance of giving





back to the community, so we made it a game," Kennedy explains. Each child was instructed to find 20 toys that they no longer played with. This activity alone took a whole day. Once they had their toy bags filled, they went to the local Purple Heart and learned the importance of helping local charities by making a donation.
