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SPEAK LOVE

CELEBRATE LOVE DAY

Have a dedicated day for your family to spend time showing love through homemade gifts and love notes.

TEACH POSITIVITY

Show your child how to see the bright side of difficult situations and let him know that you will all get through it.

COMMUNICATE WELL

Communicate well with your child to make sure he knows what's going on and feels like a integral member of the family.

RESPECT OTHERS

Let your child witness you encouraging your spouse, your mother, his teacher, and even the overstressed waitress at the restaurant. This will help him know how to demonstrate love to others.

BE A PEACEMAKER
