Middleton's wedding dress garnered so much international attention that it has its own Facebook page. So what better way to make a bride feel like royalty than by wearing a dress fit for a princess? Lace sleeves are timeless and offer a softer, more romantic feel than strapless gowns by bringing in touches of Victorian

elegance.

A Splash of Bright Color
The hot wedding colors for 2012 will be ivories and creams with a splash of tangerine - a twist on last year's coral. Katie Rhodes Wimberley loves how the tangerine flowers in her bouquet really pop in pictures against the more muted palette. "Just don't go overboard on color to keep it elegant, timeless, and romantic," shares Woodward.

Brides of 2012 want to give their guests as much taste variety as possible, whether that means having two flavors in each bite of their wedding cake or replacing the traditional groom's cake with the couple's favorite dessert. Local bride Chelsea Akard and her groom are considering a chocolate cake with a raspberry center. Wimberley and her husband chose an amaretto cake with cream cheese filling. "I think most people put the

cake in their mouths thinking it was just white cake with white icing, but they were pleasantly surprised," she shares. Also popular, says Woodward, are cake pops and mini desserts.

Natural Hair and Makeup

Middleton reportedly did her own hair and makeup for the big day. Katy brides are also opting for soft, natural makeup and loose, lightly curled hair. "They want to look like themselves, only a little better," Woodward says. Akard, a summer bride, agrees. "I want my fiancé to recognize me when I walk down the aisle," she shares. "I don't wear a lot of makeup regularly, so on my wedding day, I want to look like myself."

Repurposed Items as Décor

Budget-friendly, repurposed items will play a key role in décor for 2012 for their vintage feel. Ashton Bramlett, who recently married her husband Mark, used mason jars filled with wildflowers to give her wedding a garden vibe. "It's simple, but elegant," she says. Lindsay Dawson, another Katy bride, included her mother's and mother-in-law's wedding dresses and family wedding and anniversary photos in a special display for guests to enjoy before the reception. The display was the perfect way to honor brides and the importance of family through the generations.


















Partly due to the economy and price per guest, weddings are becoming smaller and more intimate affairs. "My clients are inviting only those people that they can't possibly imagine not having at their wedding," shares Woodward. Akard wants to keep numbers under 150. "I don't want to be at my wedding reception and see someone and think, 'Who is that?" says Akard. "It will feel more special if we look around and know everyone

at our wedding."

Ditching the High Heels
Katy brides want their weddings to be all about comfort and fun, and sometimes that means losing the heels after the ceremony. Wimberley opted to forego heels entirely at her Katy wedding, walking down the aisle in white slippers and then changing into her cowboy boots for the reception. Other footwear includes matching flip-flops or even sneakers for the wedding party.

Signature Cocktails
For those Katy brides whose budget may not include an open bar, a cocktail station is a great way to go. Couples can choose one or two drinks or a signature concoction that goes with the theme of their wedding. Wimberley opted for margarita machines. "Looking back, I wouldn't have had it any other way," she shares. "The margaritas tasted great, and I think everyone enjoyed them."

# Moving Outside of Traditional Venues

Brides have an increasing number of venues to choose from in the Katy area, most with beautiful outdoor settings. Bramlett decided to wed at the Brookwood Community, so that her ceremony and reception could be at the same location. Also, if you opt for an outdoor altar, most of the décor comes from the natural beauty of your serene surroundings. Wimberley and her husband Jake tied the knot at Agave Road in Katy, hosting their reception there afterwards. "Even though we didn't get married in a church, our pastor still married us and gave a traditional Christian ceremony," she shares.

Creative Guestbooks
A guestbook no longer means just signatures. At her spring 2012 wedding, Bramlett had a wishing tree.
"Everyone [could] hang their wish on a branch, and years later, we can look at their wishes for us," she says. Woodward's brides have even rented a photo booth, so guests can make a picture guestbook.

Dawson asked friends and family to sign the mat around a framed photo of the couple, and it now hangs in their bedroom. "We get to enjoy our 'guestbook' every day," she says.



Friday and Sunday Weddings
With Middleton's wedding to England's Prince
William having taken place on a Friday, it's becoming
more popular to marry on a day other than Saturday.
Many brides find that their dream venue is booked
every Saturday for the next year, and off-day
weddings can actually be a much more affordable
option. In her winter wedding, Dawson walked
down the aisle on a Thursday in order to book
preferred vendors after a short engagement. It also
allowed her more time with guests. "[I enjoyed] the
continued presence of family and friends who stayed
in town for the holiday," she shares. Wimberley's and
Bramlett's nuptials both fell on a Sunday.

The right lighting can transform a dull space into a soft, serene, and even whimsical setting for your ceremony or reception. Woodward has seen a drop in the amount spent on flowers as brides incorporate more candles into their decorating scheme. Bramlett used lanterns to line the aisle, adding a rosy glow to her ceremony. "It's a much cheaper and more beautiful and romantic route than flowers," she shares. Akard will use candles, candelabras, and Christmas lights. "Guests [will] feel like they are spending an evening in a French city," she says.


# Making Your Wedding Your Own

Lace gowns aside, the biggest influence Middleton had over weddings of 2012 is that she taught brides it is okay to bend the rules a little. If you don't like a tradition, do something fun and new. "I always interview our couples to see what kinds of foods they like, what kinds of music they like to dance to, and what they like and don't like about weddings they have attended," shares Woodward. "Putting time and attention in to making your guests feel comfortable and including them in the couple's story makes one wedding so different from another." The most important thing is that your wedding reflects who you and your groom are as a couple. KM








# Honoring Each Guests' Unique Needs


















Local deputy Ricky Feild lives in Katy

# **Accepting His Title**




# DINING ROOM DO'S AND DON'TS
