

The NCL is a six-year program that begins accepting inductees in the seventh grade. Daughters are referred to as Ticktockers and partner alongside each other and Patronesses, their mothers, to learn core values that will sustain them long after their time with NCL is done. contributors in their communities," says Andrea Perez, a member of the Ladybird Chapter's publicity committee.



Members are encouraged to join for a variety of reasons including strengthening their bond with their mother, learning to serve the needs of their community, knowledge of social etiquette, and acquiring skills such as event planning.
