Deep Appreciation


Love has changed from being a passion for experiencing new things together, to a deep appreciation for what we bring to each other's lives.

Romantic Getaways


We keep the romance alive by having a date night at least twice a month and go on a yearly trip as a couple.

Personal Chef


I wish that someone would have told me what an awesome cook Guy was and that I'd never be skinny again.

Make Time


Even if you feel you are too busy, it's important to schedule time for just the two of you.

Marriage takes work - picking your battles, letting the small stuff go, being considerate, and learning to grow with your spouse.





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
