The Importance of Regular Vision Screening Tests in Children

Dr. Jane Edmond, pediatric neuro ophthalmologist at Texas Children's Hospital, urges parents to make sure children get regular vision screenings. Undetected vision problems can set a child up for learning difficulties, poor grades, and bad behavior. Estimates show that up to one in 30 children could have amblyopia, or lazy eye, one out of 20 could have strabismus, or eye misalignment, and one out of seven has a significant refractive error, which is poor vision that can be corrected with glasses or contact lenses. Signs of these common vision problems include squinting, getting too close to the television, eyes that are not straight, head tilting when looking at objects, headaches when reading, or avoidance of reading.
