As a young girl, April Hughes dreamed of having a large family. "My younger sister and I were five and a half years apart," the Calgary, Canada native recalls. Today, the Katy couple are proud parents to six children. Helping Hands

The Hughes parents stress the importance of hard work to their children, and each child is assigned chores. "We live in a beautiful community and have been richly blessed with things," says Ben. "But as a boy from Idaho, I learned to work by feeding cows, mowing lawns, and bailing hay. Some of those opportunities don't exist in the suburbs, but we've been able to provide them other opportunities to work and do their chores."

April welcomes any sort of help around the house. "The two oldest are responsible for the main floors. On Saturdays, everybody cleans the bathrooms together," says April. "The youngest empty the garbage, and everybody clears their own dishes from the table and puts them in the sink or dishwasher."

Their extended family doesn't live in Texas, but they get lots of support from their friends at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints and other friends in the community. Ben volunteers with the youth at church, as well, and has

coached some of his son's sports teams. April has been active in the PTA at the schools the kids attend and served as a Cub Scout den leader.

"We have a wonderful network of friends here in Katy from other members of our church to those we've met on our children's sports teams or from school and friendly neighbors as well," he says. "Folks in Katy have always been willing to lend a hand."

Playing Together, Staying Together

The parents require that each of their children plays at least one sport and is involved in music in some way, whether it is playing an instrument or singing. "We have a piano in the home," says April. "My husband and I grew up playing the piano."

When one of the children is participating in a game or event, the entire family supports them. "All of us go together," says April. "Nobody gets to stay home."

An outdoorsy family, the Hughes clan enjoys biking, going for walks, and playing football and soccer together at Seven Lakes High School. The children also like to spend time in their own backyard, doing archery or swimming in their pool.

"We love the Cinco Ranch community," adds Ben. "We really enjoy the pathways, bayous, and numerous lakes around Cinco Ranch for running, fishing, and exploring."

Couple Time

To carve out couple-time amid their many responsibilities, Ben and April get creative. "Sometimes it's grocery shopping on a Saturday night, or we will talk in the car," shares April. "We go out on formal nights for dinner." April advises other parents struggling to juggle family and other commitments to keep perspective. "Don't try to conform to what everybody else thinks a family should be. You've got to let the little things go and have fun with it. They are not little forever, so just enjoy it." KM
