


"Most people will say trust, and while that is part of it, I would say making sure you realize what a good partner you have and cherishing your family no matter how big or small."

# JIM AND LINDA CRISP MARRIED 50 YEARS



#### ROGELIO AND RAQUEL SOSA MARRIED 57 YEARS


