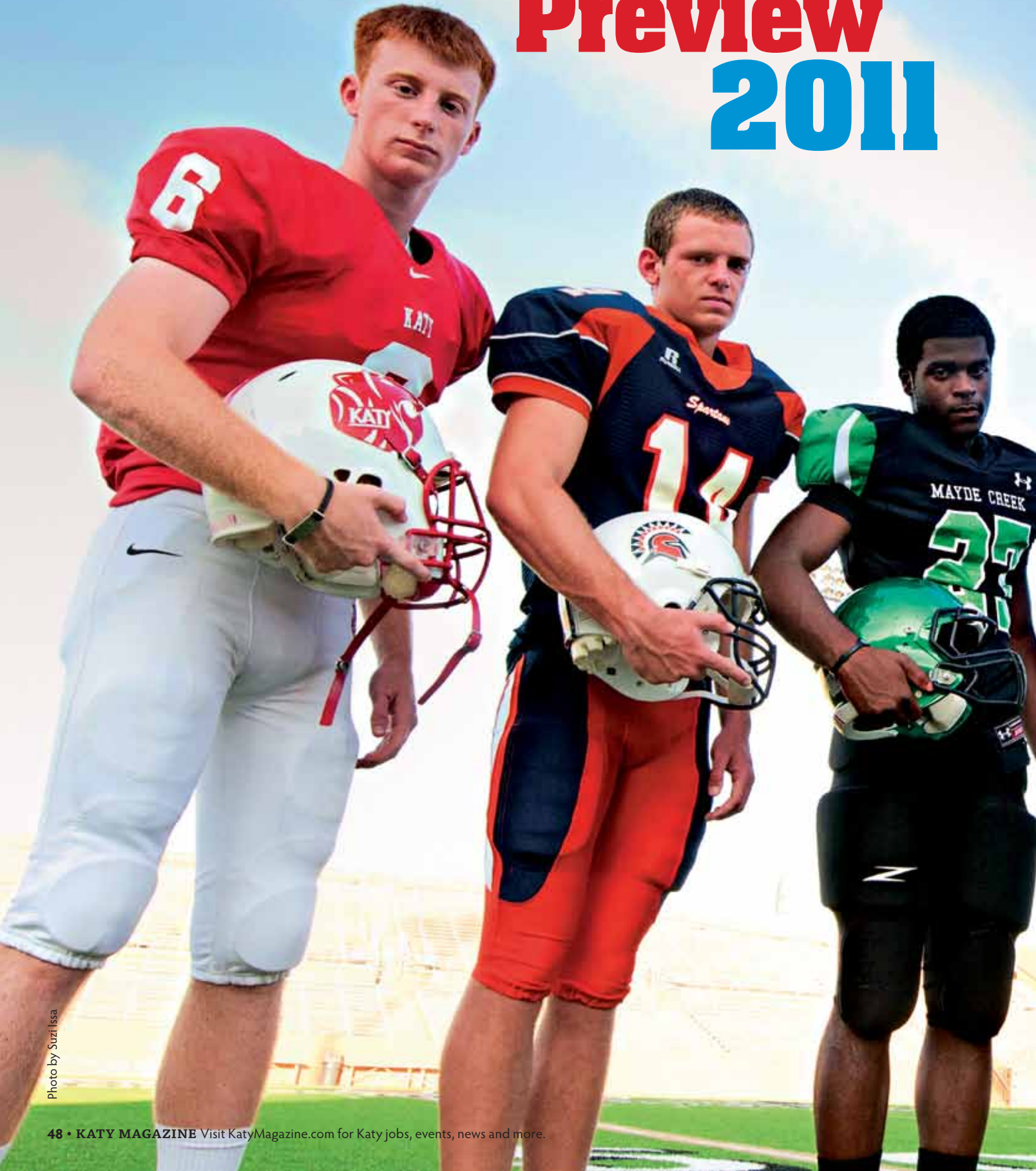

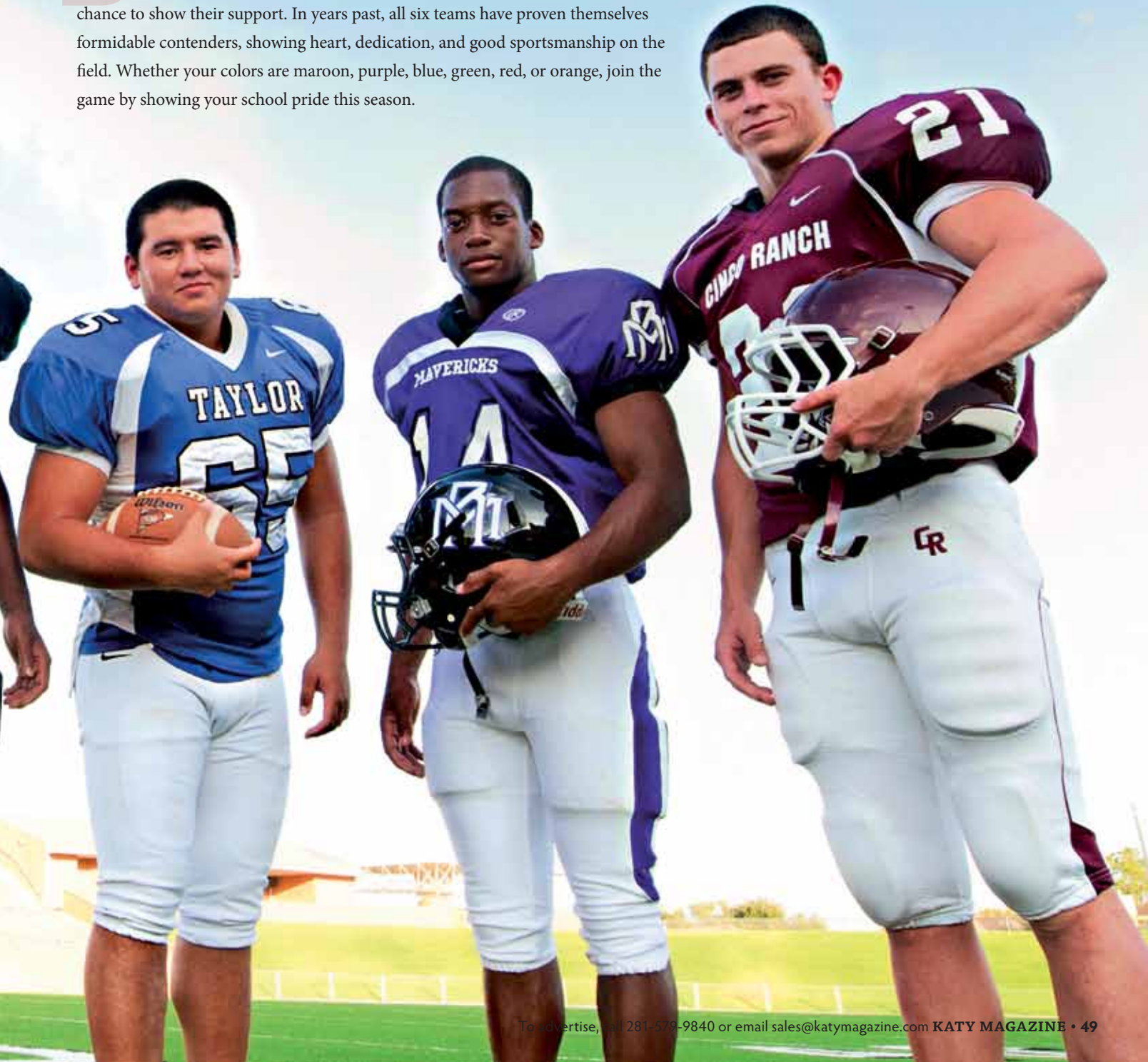

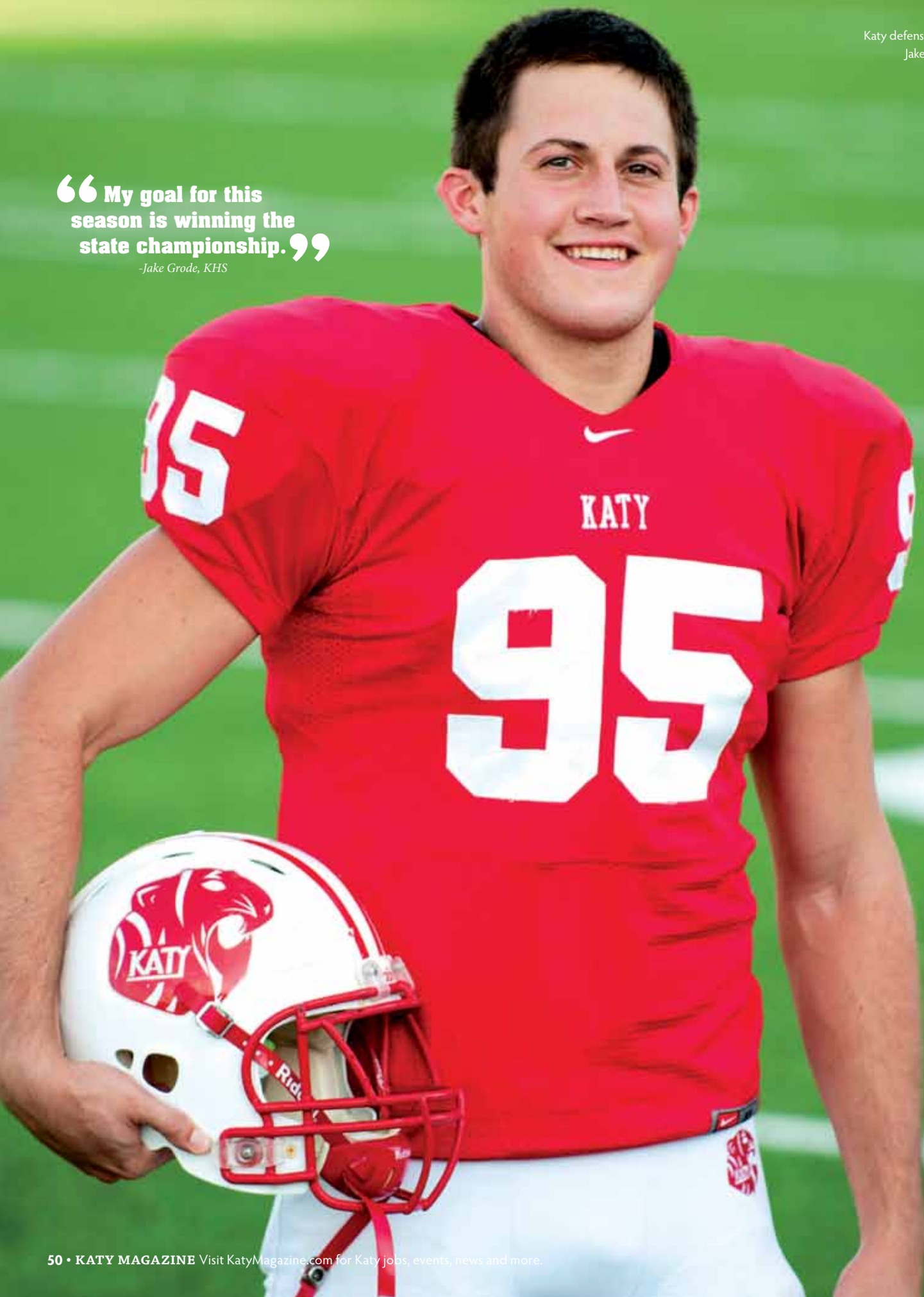

Are You Ready for Some Football?

High school football teams in Katy ISD gear up for the 2011 season

Athletic talent reigns throughout Katy ISD's six high school football teams, which boast some of the greatest ability the state will see during the 2011-2012 season. Top dog Katy looks to compete for a championship and redeem its heartbreaking, last-minute loss to Pearland in the state semi-finals last season. Cinco Ranch aims to impress again with one of the state's most gifted teams, and Taylor strives for consistency, with both teams grappling for a coveted spot that would allow them to go deep into the playoffs.

Seven Lakes, the youngest school in the district, aspires to grab hold of a postseason berth it barely missed out on last year to Taylor. Morton Ranch isn't satisfied with last year's record and the athletic team will look for opportunities to shock its way into a surprising playoff run. Mayde Creek seeks to redeem a losing season and invigorate the school with a resurgence of life and pride in its determined team. All six teams stand proud of their veteran leadership and the experience they bring to the field, confident in what each teammate can contribute to attain the ultimate goal - to be champions.

Cinco Ranch Cougars

After battling their way to the third round of district playoffs last year before losing to the Katy Tigers, the Cougars hope to continue building off the momentum of their team. "Being hungry for success and staying healthy will be important to the goals of our team," says Cinco Ranch head football coach Don Clayton. "Every year is a new one with its own identity. We are looking forward to the 2011 team creating a successful identity for themselves, their school, and their community." With team spirit running high, Cinco Ranch seniors Russell Cuellar and Alex Ludowig predict the Cougars will be a better team come playoff time this year.

Priority number one for the Cougars this season is to find a quarterback that can distribute the ball to super-talented running back Jamel James and wide receivers Ludowig and James Rhoden. Going into the pre-season, filling the quarterback position remained somewhat of a question. The offensive line, led by Trey Parker, should be stout and will give James the potential to eclipse the marks set by Southern Methodist University signee KC Nlemchi, which is no small feat.

Tackling machines Cuellar and linebacker Ayodele Illesanmi are capable of making plays all over the field and look to inspire a young defense that will be expected to grow up quick. Special teams should be a strength for Cinco Ranch this year, with returning punter Jack Steed and placekicker Jacob Farmen, both possessing impressive legs and plenty of experience.

Katy Tigers

Patience is a word coach Gary Joseph knows a thing or two about. It seems that by the end of every year, regardless of their returning

talent, the Tigers are in contention for a state championship, a true testament to the patience and hard work of a dedicated coaching staff. Despite returning only eight of 22 starters from last year's team, playing for the district championship and a state title run are readily attainable goals. "If there's one thing I want people to know, it's that we will be a good football team by the end of the year," asserts coach Joseph.

Following the lead of Andy Dalton and Bo Levi Mitchell, quarterback Brooks Haack will look to lead the Tigers to a state championship title. Haack and junior runningback Adam Taylor make up one of the area's most renowned backfields. Cameron Glover, Cole Gessler, and Aaron Sowell form the nucleus of a solid offensive line, and wide receivers Jordan Thompson and junior Kyle Fulks provide Haack with talented targets.

A tradition-rich defense should once again be unyielding and has strength and leadership at each level. Defensive linemen Jake Grode, Matt Dimon, and Jake Miller, linebackers Brandon Ebrecht and Bo Brown, and defensive backs Quinn Atwood and Drake Dowling will provide leadership and experience. Younger, talented players like sophomore Jacob Blomstrom and possible two-way starter Fulks look to have break-out seasons. Kicker Jeff Johnson led the district in scoring last season and shores up the special teams. The Tigers will play to represent their fans and more importantly, to make the community proud, say both Ebrecht and Grode.

Mayde Creek Rams

Returning to the playoffs is one specific goal that the Mayde Creek Rams look to attain during the 2011 season. While speed and experience are team strengths, work ethic and veteran leadership define this team, according to head coach Lance Carter. "The seniors are great young men that have worked very hard in their four years," he shares.

For the Rams offense, it all starts in the trenches with a big, talented offensive line, led by returning starters Jon Zepeda, Ivan Torres, Cameron Hodge, Ty Carter, and Andy Martinez. If they can give speedy running backs Troy McCormick, Donito Harris, Ronald Winston, and Basil Fares room to run, the ground attack should be very productive. Wide receiver Jordan Allen should also contribute as an offensive weapon.

On the other side of the ball, defensive tackle Alejandro Palana is the strongest player on the team and has a great motor, says coach Carter. Defensive backs Jermaine Cotton and Denman Watson lead a veteran secondary whose experience and play-making ability rival that of any other team in the district. While not big, the defense is aggressive and deep. "We might be small, but we are mean and a school with a lot of pride," says Hodge.

Morton Ranch Mavericks

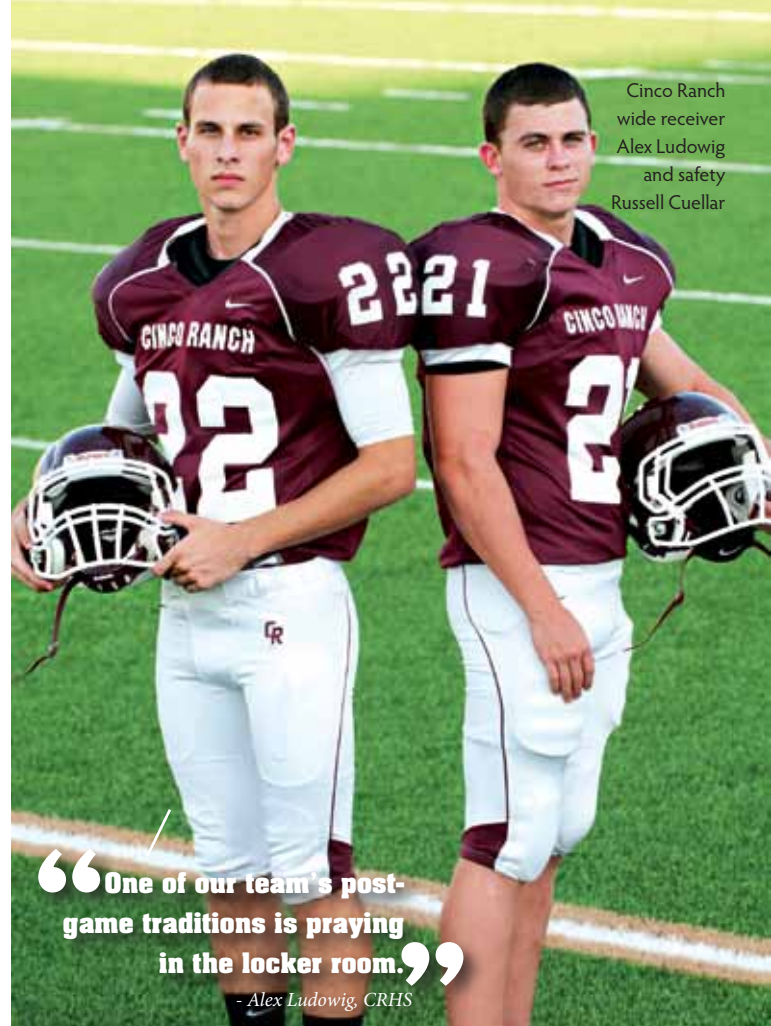
The youth of the past couple seasons has given way to experience and extreme athleticism on a greatly improved Maverick football team. "Morton Ranch football is coming alive," says head coach Dave Meadows. "We will compete for every yard, and will make ourselves known."

Team standout and defensive end Dan Hunter is on a short list for the most talented football player in both the city and district and recently committed to play college ball for the LSU Tigers. Hunter, along with defensive end Donald Williams and linebacker Chris Tyler, will make life tough for opposing quarterbacks this year and should allow corner Brandon Tanksley and safeties Quandre Washington and John Navin to make plays in the secondary.

Quarterback and leader Terrion Poitier will be joined by the explosive and versatile Deion Williams and lightning-fast tailbacks Eli Hall and EJ Achelus to form a backfield that is capable of taking it the distance if given a little daylight. If linemen David Yee, Demarcus Johnson, Carlos Escobar, and Sahr Saffa can gel as a unit giving Poitier ample time to throw, wide receiver Brian Wiltz is another reliable threat. "We are a hard-working team and we are getting better," assures Poitier. "We want to show everyone what the Mavericks can do by winning football games."

Seven Lakes Spartans

Coach Kevin O'Keefe can sense his young Seven Lakes program is on its way to developing a successful football tradition. Veteran players are stepping up to lead, determined to take the Spartans back to the playoffs after just missing out last season. "This group has demonstrated a real commitment to winning throughout the off-season and spring and summer workouts," says O'Keefe. "Their

overall determination and toughness will be a big difference for us.” There are plenty of offensive weapons in running backs John Oglesby and Denzel Guillard, along with wide receivers Jared Crosby, Cole Akard, and Karson Ota. If Spartan quarterback Kaleb Morton proves to be a good game-manager, Seven Lakes will be a team that gives others in the district trouble. The offensive line, anchored by center Cody Henderson, is young, but stout. “Limiting mistakes and making big plays when needed will determine our success this season,” says Morton.

The defense returns key experience in linebackers Bryant Sugg, Joel North, Derek Orlando, and Spencer Evans, in addition to a big play-making safety, Adam Jones, who leads a capable secondary. Developing young, defensive playmakers up front and early in the season will determine how far this team goes.

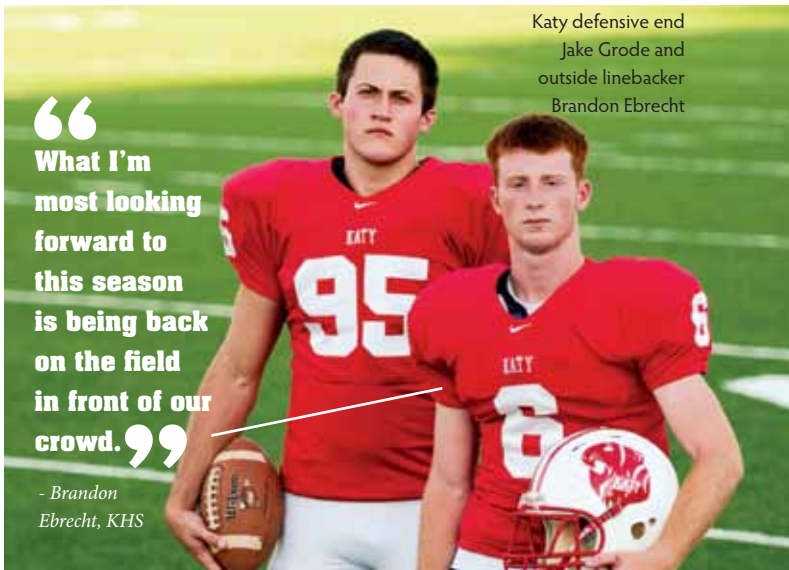
Taylor Mustangs

Taylor coach Flint Risien will lean heavily on his first senior class to take the Mustangs back to the playoffs after going two rounds deep last season. “What encourages and excites me about this team is their approach to all aspects of the game, especially practice,” Risien says. “They are showing maturity in regards to preparation. Now we are looking for consistency.”

Last year’s defense showed flashes of brilliance, pitching shut-outs against two district opponents and limiting high-powered Memorial to just 14 points. Although the Mustangs have to replace nine of 11 starters, returning defensive tackle Connor Cella is one of the most highly regarded players in the area. Cella and defensive backs Justin Colondres and Markus Temple will look to lead the young, but athletic defense.

Quarterback Hunter Riggs, the district’s top returning passer, looks to air it out again this season. With four of five starters returning on the offensive line, including Jason David, Anthony Keverline, Ryan Arebalos, and Tommy Gavrel, the talented Riggs should have plenty of time to target wide receiver Josh Aming and several young, impressive newcomers. According to Cella and David, leadership from Taylor’s veteran players is key for them to make a playoff run this season. **KM**

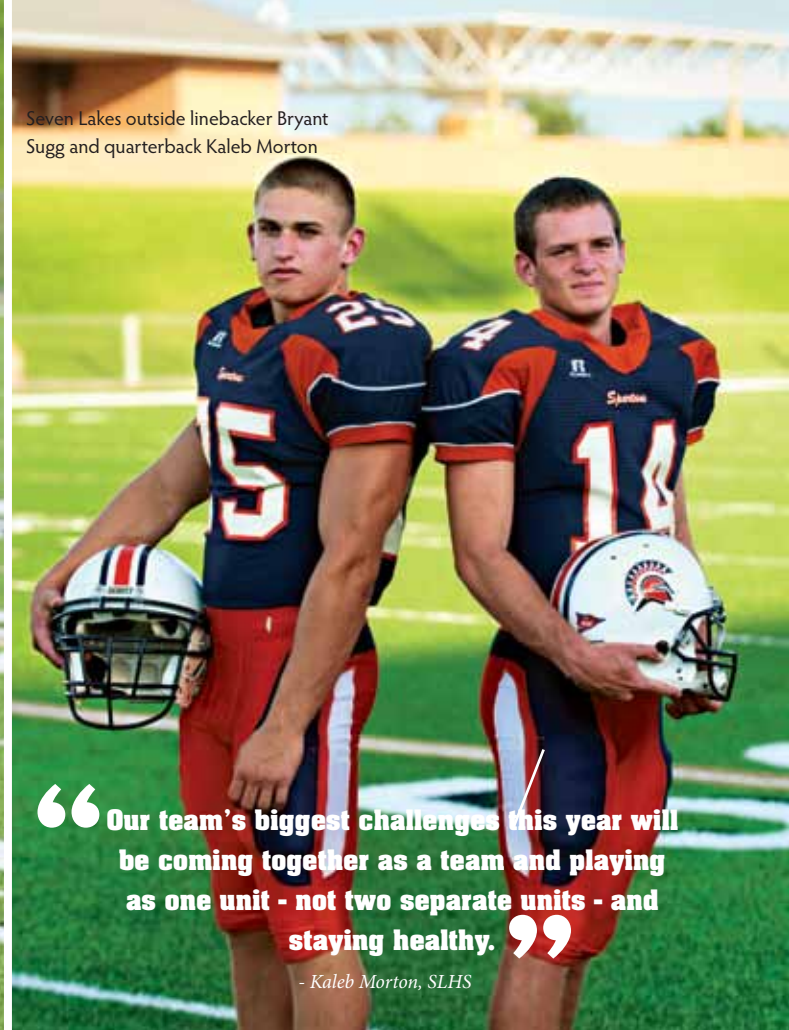

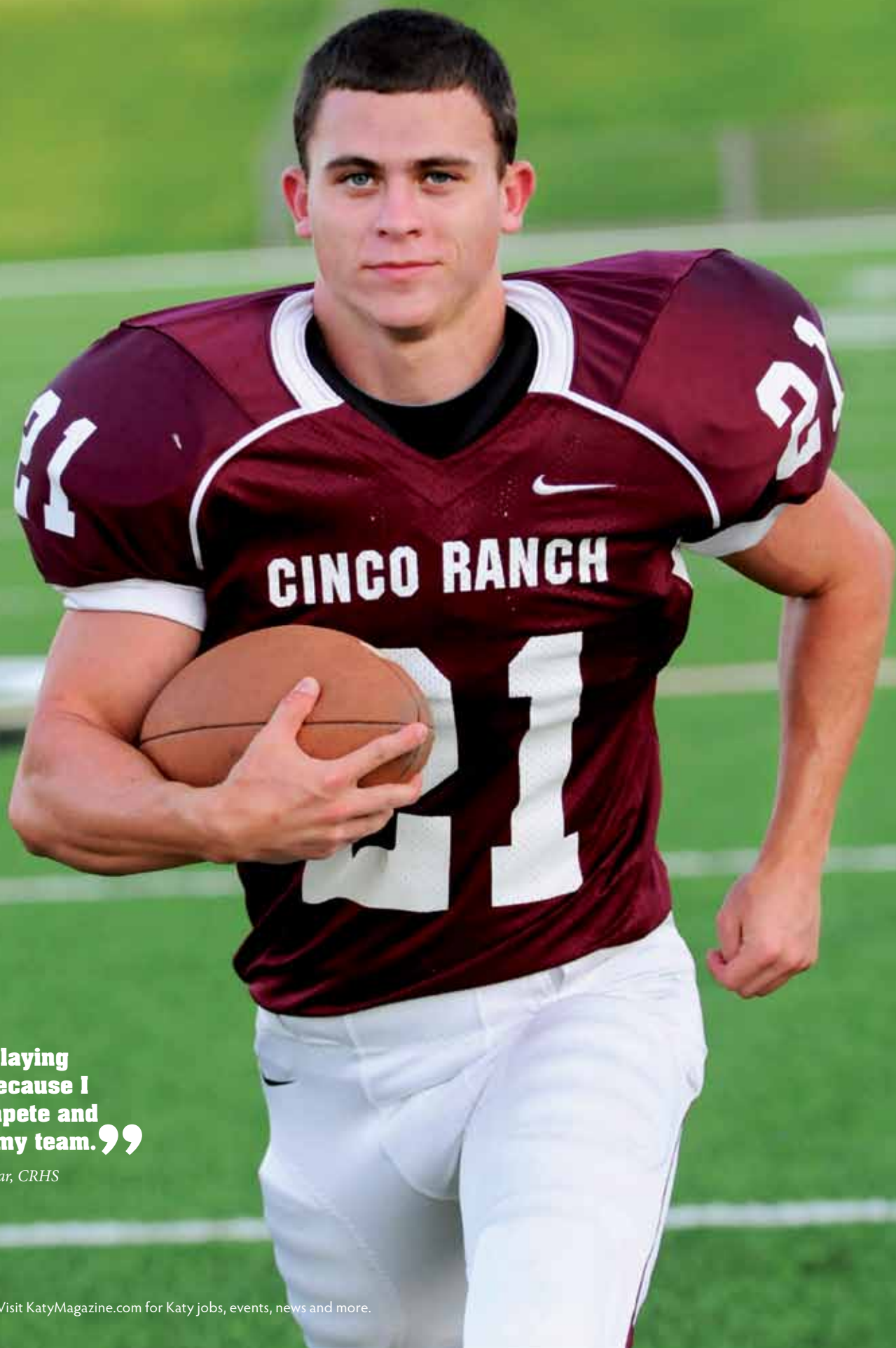

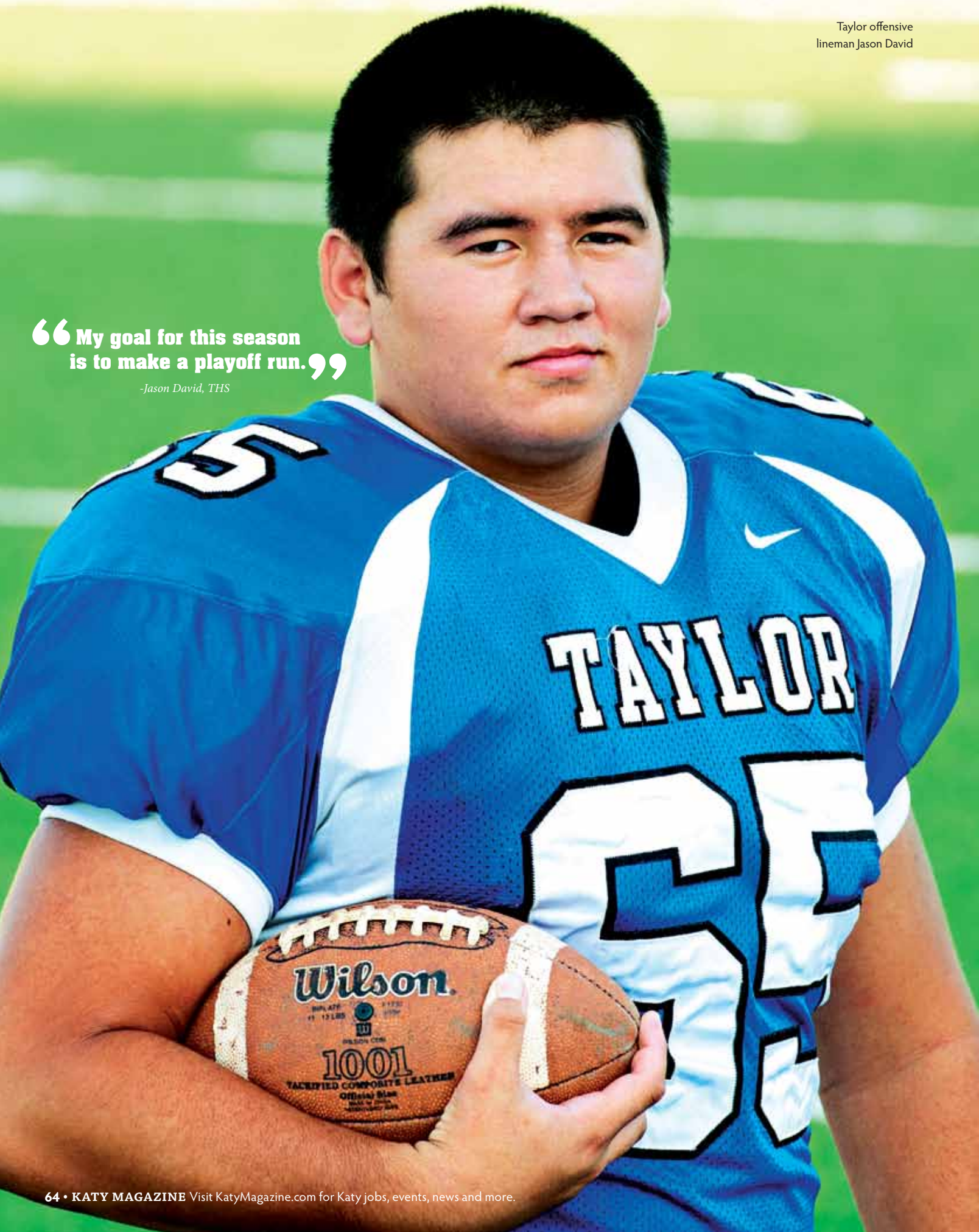
