Young states, "If she wanted to go to a school sporting event, knowing she had a project due that week, we would let her decide if she could handle it or not. Believe in Your Child...And in Yourself

The best advice Young can give other parents preparing to send their children to college is to believe they will weather the storms and come out stronger on the other side. "Our kids will rise to this occasion that is before them. There is nothing more valuable than a family who is behind their child from the beginning moment up until that letting go moment." Skopak agrees, "Let your children know that you believe in them and that you're terrifically proud of what they're doing. Tell them often. Let them know you're their biggest cheerleader. When they fall, and we all do, be there to cheer



them on as they get up, regroup, and get back into the race." Young echoes, "It is a scary thing. You want to know what your children are doing every minute and know they are safe at all times. The thought of "no control" is frightening. At the same time you have to be confident that you've done your best in raising them and trust that they're in good hands."

"We have to go through it, we need to go through it, and I want to go through it smiling through the tears," she says.

"I will certainly grieve the loss of that door opening at 3 p.m. and Matt walking in, but I'm so grateful for those memories, and I'm choosing to look forward to the new memories we're going to make," says Skopak.
