Joining the Sisterhood

Epsilon Mu is the Katy chapter of the Alpha Delta Kappa sorority, a sisterhood of teachers. Although the sorority was originally founded in 1947, the Katy chapter didn't get its start until the 1980s. Today, most of the members of the Katy chapter are elementary educators, but membership is open to teachers of all grade levels.

President-elect and Hayes Elementary teacher, Paula Opiela joined the sorority as a means to network with other teachers in her area. "I wasn't in the district that long and didn't know a lot of teachers from other buildings and other schools," she says. Gigi Bethke, immediate past president and Creech Elementary teacher, says the organization makes it easier to get involved with charities. "It's always more fun if you [volunteer] with a friend," she says.

Meetings take place at different Katy ISD schools each month and offer the perfect chance for teachers from campuses around the area to meet, discuss ideas, and learn from one another. "What really drew me [in] was the caliber of teachers that were a part of it," says past president, Barbara Landis. "They really care about their students and others."

The Epsilon Mu Social Scene

The chapter prides itself on promoting a sense of community among area educators. Every year, the three Houston chapters come together to celebrate Alpha Delta Kappa's Founders' Day, the sorority's biggest event of the year. Chapters take turns planning the festivities, and this past year, the Epsilon Mu chapter even invited its Galveston sisters to join in on the fun. Christmas also presents a time of celebration for the sisters, with an annual party and an altruistic gift to those in need.

The sorority also connects teachers with members of the Katy community. Recently, the Epsilon Mu sisters had the opportunity to meet the mayor and learn about future plans for Katy, as well as the role they can play in the community as it continues to grow and change.

Goals for Greatness in the Community

In addition to the social aspect the sorority provides for teachers, Alpha Delta Kappa also aims to help the community and support education. "We wish to encourage one another to be a shining light to those in our community," says Opiela.


On an international level, the entire sorority raises money for both St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and Susan G. Komen for the Cure. In the past two years alone, Alpha Delta Kappa members have given more than \$7.7 million in monetary gifts and have provided more than 1.8 million hours of volunteer service in their communities. This year, the international organization is also sponsoring Project SAVE, whose goal is to build a school in Vietnam in conjunction with the Veterans' Vietnam Restoration Project.

In the Katy community, the Epsilon Mu chapter spends time volunteering with Katy Christian Ministries, hosting programs for nursing homes, and raising money for Casa de Esparanza, a child advocacy program. The chapter also provides scholarships for members' children going to college. "Last year, we went to a nursing home and did bingo night. They asked if we could come back every month," Opiela laughs. "I think we are going to try doing it at least once a semester."

Alpha Delta Kappa has given these Katy area teachers an out of the classroom experience that has grown into a real family. Everyone agrees that talking with other experienced educators in the community and across the country has helped them learn new methods of teaching. The best part of being a member of the Epsilon Mu chapter, though, is the friendships that are made as members do their part for a great community. **KM**
