Friends & Neighbors Gather Daily for a Local Tradition

Old Katy was built on rice farms and time-honored traditions, one of which includes gathering around coffee tables across the community for a cup of Joe every morning. Many have enjoyed the pastime of meeting with a Katy coffee club, and while they may have changed somewhat over the years, the focus of each club remains on community. "They're the heartbeat of the community and a great resource for local news," says former Katy Mayor Doyle Callender, whose love for coffee clubs was passed down to him by his late father John Dude Callender. "My father loved the Katy coffee clubs."

Coffee & Community

Johnny Nelson, another former Katy mayor and owner of Katy Sales and Supply, has been attending coffee clubs since 1969. "It began at my business with rice farmers coming to mix and mingle and share the news," he says. Over the years, as rice farming declined, the topics expanded. "Now we never know what we're going to talk about," shares Nelson.


Billy Caldwell has been meeting with his coffee club since 1955. The location has moved over the years, but currently, they meet at Snappy's every Monday through Friday at 5:30 a.m. The time of fellowship and friendship has become a meaningful daily routine to Caldwell. His group plays a game each meet. "It is fun, unless you're the one stuck with the tab," he laughs.

The previous winner of the game starts off the fun each morning. They pick a number between one and 300. Then the person to the left makes a guess. The original player with the number informs them if it is higher or lower. They go around the circle and narrow down the guessing field. The person that wins picks up the coffee tab. The game has taken on more risk over the years. When they first began it, they played at Miss Alexander's, when coffee was a dime a cup. Now at Snappy's, it's a \$1.50 a cup.

The Old Katy coffee clubs have watched the city grow and change, but perhaps the greatest change has occurred within. "We're mostly retired and many in our group have passed," Nelson says. Callender adds, "We've also seen the expansion of the city, and as people have become more busy in their lives, coffee clubs have become a dying breed." It's time that is hurting coffee clubs, not an increase in places offering coffee, such as Starbucks. "People want a sense of community and that local feel," explains Nelson.

Bringing Back the Trend

The coffee clubs that these men have grown up loving may be changing, but coffee clubs in general have evolved. You may not call it an official coffee club, but think about all the Bible studies, mothers' groups, book clubs, or many special interest


